



15TH WORLD SCOUT MOOT ICELAND

The **15th World Scout Moot** will be held in **Iceland 25th July to 2nd August 2017**. It is an official event of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), hosted and organized by the Icelandic Boy and Girl Scout Association, for young people aged between 18 and 25 inclusive.

If you are a Scout in a National Scout Organization that is a member of WOSM and if you are born on or between the dates of 2nd August 1991 and 25th July 1999 you are eligible as a participant. If you are born on or before 1st August 1991 you are eligible to join the Moot's International Service Team (IST).

PARTICIPATION

Eligible participants to the World Scout Moot are those aged between 18 and 25 – or those born on or between the dates of 2nd August 1991 and 25th July 1999. The Moot is equally open to young men and women that are members of a National Scout Organization belonging to WOSM.

Members of a National Scout Organization that are 26 years of age, or born on or before 1st August 1991, can join the Moot's International Service Team (IST). National Scout Associations are encouraged to include as many 26-30 year olds in the IST as possible. The IST is made up of volunteers that assist with the delivery of the Moot and is composed of local and international Scouts.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE TEAM

With expected 5.000 participants at the 15th World Scout Moot in Iceland in 2017, the Moot will need up to 1.000 people in the International Service Team (IST). The Moot organizers expect that around half the IST team will be Icelandic and half from the different countries attending the Moot. Following WOSM's guidelines for World Scout Moots no participating country can have more than 100 IST members and contingents cannot have more IST members than participants

ICELAND

Iceland is a truly unique country that is worth visiting. Not only is its nature unique, but the culture and atmosphere is something special too

MOOT FEE

The Moot fee is **USD 250** for every member of the contingent (participants, IST and contingent leaders).

Included in the fee is the Moot program, meals from lunch on the 25th of July to dinner on 2nd of August. Transport from entry and to exit point in Reykjavik, camping kit (including cooking equipment), medical care in the case of illness (excluding pre-existing conditions) or accidents, including minor surgery or treatment when necessary during the period of the 15th World Scout Moot. Medication and any cost relating to hospitalization are NOT included in fee.
