

ADVERTISMENT FOR THE CHIEF COMMISSIONER'S POSITION AT THE KENYA SCOUTS ASSOCATION

Established by an Act of Parliament Cap 219 of the Laws of Kenya, the Kenya Scouts Association is an educational Movement for young people, which provides non-formal education that complements the core-curriculum offered in our educational institutions.

The Association is looking for suitable candidate to fill the position of the **Chief Commissioner**. The Chief Commissioner reports directly to the Chief Scout and the National Scouts Council and provides leadership in the advancement of the Scout Movement and management of Volunteers (Scouters) within the country.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES/DUTIES/TASKS

- 1. Responsible for overall Leadership and Management of the Association
- 2. Chair meetings of the National Scout Board
- 3. Chair the National Council meeting in the absence of the Chief Scout
- 4. Appoint National Commissioners in consultation with the Chief Scout and the elected members of National Scout Board
- 5. Ensure proper delivery and implementation of the Scout Program
- 6. Resource mobilization for the Association
- 7. Co-ordinate the work of all Commissioners
- 8. Sign warrants for Commissioners and other Scouters.
- 9. Registration of County Scout Councils
- 10. Withdraw, suspend or cause to be withdrawn the warrants or temporary permits of any Scouter upon recommendation from the relevant committees.
- 11. Withdraw, suspend or cause to be withdrawn the registration of County Scout Councils or Regional Cluster Committees
- 12. Recommend to the Chief Scout the presentation of such Honors and Awards as may be approved by the National Scout
- 13. May represent Kenya Scouts Association in national and international scouting fora, and also to the public and other authorities or organizations
- 14. May preside over Scout functions and ceremonies
- 15. Assign duties to Commissioners and any other officers of the Association as needs arise.
- 16. Present a progress report for the preceding year to the AGM of the National Scout Council
- 17. Any other duties as may be assigned by the Patron or the National Scout Council

QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE JOB

The ideal candidate;

- 1. Must be a first Degree holder from a recognized University
- 2. Must have strong computer knowledge and skills
- 3. Must be at least 26 years and above
- 4. Must have at least 3 beads
- 5. Must be an active member of the Kenya Scouts Association and currently registered in 2022
- 6. Must meet the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya

ESSENTIAL CHARACTERISTICS:

- 1. Excellent communication skills
- 2. Strong leadership, analytical, negotiation and organizational skills
- 3. Demonstrated ability to work both independently and within a team, assess priorities and manage multiple activities with attention to detail.
- 4. Good interpersonal skills
- 5. A good role model, and a person of high moral character and integrity
- 6. Ability to interpret and offer guidance on policy matters
- 7. Available and accessible
- 8. Ability to interact with the youth, guide, counsel and share with them
- 9. Ability to represent and defend the interests of Kenya Scouts Association in local and international forums
- 10. Innovative in scouting developmental matters
- 11. Must have successfully managed previous scouting leadership roles.
