
The Elephant award is given to personalities who have immensely supported the course of scouting in a given country in many ways.

Hon. Kaparo received this award for using personal resources to revamp the operations of Kenya Scouts Association when he was the Speaker of National Assembly, leading the Kenya Scouts as the Chief Scout of Kenya in planting 17 million trees in the last few years, and being an ambassador of peace for the Scouts in Kenya. He has lead Scouts in major peace initiatives such as the Marsabit peace caravan which took place from 17th to 22nd August 2015, in which young people from various counties in the country transversed the vast Marsabit County advocating for peaceful coexistence among the 14 communities living in this region.
